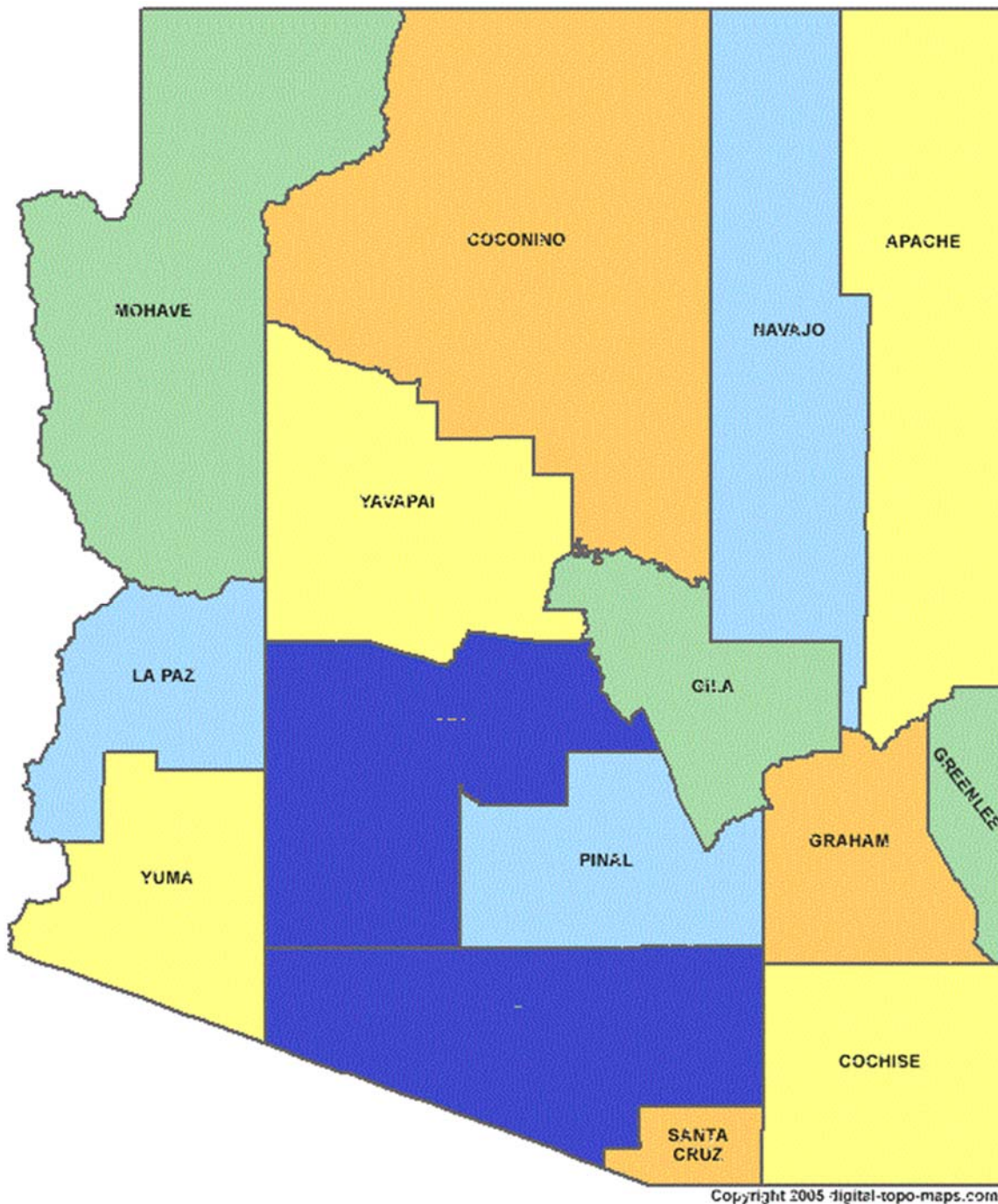

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## EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- The 2018 AZBoSCoC identified 2,187 persons experiencing homelessness in Balance of State Communities. This is a 24% increase over the prior year count. 1,085 of all persons (49.6%) were unsheltered, a 53% increase over 2017's PIT results. 2018 PIT count numbers were up for almost every sub population compared to 2017.
- Significant decreases and increases shown in comparing 2017 PIT data to 2016 and 2018 data respectively, are partly related to the addition of the VI-SPDAT assessment tool in the 2017 PIT survey that resulted in fewer completed surveys due to the additional time required and client reluctance to complete the additional questions.
- Procedurally, the 2018 PIT count was one of AZBoSCoC most successful with record numbers of volunteers and completed surveys. Improved HMIS and survey processes increased accuracy and coverage. The 2018 PIT count also followed protocols utilized in 2016 and prior years allowing for greater inter-year comparisons. This report includes comparison of 2018 data to PIT count surveys going back to 2015 to identify overall trends.
- Since 2015, AZBoSCoC PIT counts show a 9% reduction in total persons experiencing homelessness. This overall increase is not universal:
  - The majority of the decrease is related to decreases in unsheltered unaccompanied adults (4% decrease) and family households (19% decrease).
  - Conversely, two subpopulations that have been priorities for housing and resources in the AZBoSCoC, showed increases (Veterans up 5% since 2014) or minimal improvement (1% decrease) despite the resource investment.
- The PIT count identifies the presence of two small, highly vulnerable sub-populations that merit ongoing evaluation, unaccompanied youth (both under 18 and 18 to 24 year olds) and transgender/gender non-conforming persons. While small in number, these populations appear to be disproportionately likely to be unsheltered and vulnerable.
- Occupancy in emergency shelters (including domestic violence shelters) increased from 84% in 2017 to 89.5% in 2018. Increased turnover and utilization of shelter beds is key to engaging individuals into services and options for housing.
- Recommendations are provided for ongoing programming, monitoring or coordination to maintain or improve reductions of homeless populations based on the PIT data presented here. These recommendations may vary by population or issue, but generally include:
  - Improved use of existing shelter, housing and homeless housing strategies to serve more unsheltered and unserved populations and end their homelessness more rapidly.
  - Ongoing year round monitoring of key outcomes to ensure effective implementation of recommended strategies and Continuum priorities
  - Evaluation and prioritization of high acuity or vulnerable populations through coordinated entry for housing placement to reduce numbers.
  - Improved coordination with other systems or stakeholders (ex: School Districts) to improve service and housing options and outcomes.

- Next year PIT data should and will be compared to other data sources including: 1) AZBoSCoC coordinated entry assessments and associated HMIS generated By Name List data; 2) HUD System Reporting Measurements including first time homeless, housing retention, and recidivism data; and 3) improved HMIS reporting capacity for agencies, counties, LCEHs and the overall AZBoSCoC system. This will provide a more accurate and actionable profile for managing and improving the AZBoSCoC homeless system.

## BACKGROUND/OVERVIEW

The federal Homeless Emergency Assistance and Rapid Transition to Housing Act (HEARTH Act; 24 CFR §578) tasks the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to establish Continua of Care (CoCs) to administer HUD homeless funding and to coordinate local resources and strategies to end homelessness for all persons. HUD has approved the Arizona Balance of State Continuum of Care (AZBoSCoC) to include the thirteen Arizona counties outside Maricopa (Phoenix) and Pima (Tucson). The AZBoSCoC is governed by an 11 member Governance Advisory Board (GAB) elected from the community to execute the responsibilities outlined in the HEARTH Act. The GAB has named the Arizona Department of Housing (ADOH) as the Collaborative Applicant under HUD rules for the Arizona Balance of State Continuum of Care (AZBoSCoC) to submit the annual application for HUD Continuum of Care funding and to perform other HEARTH Act required activities including:

- Planning and implementing services for persons who are experiencing homelessness in thirteen counties in Arizona including Apache, Cochise, Coconino, Gila, Graham, Greenlee, La Paz, Mohave, Navajo, Pinal, Santa Cruz, Yavapai and Yuma.
- Through the ADOH as fiscal agent, the AZBoSCoC administers and distributes approximately \$4 million in HUD funding to provide permanent supportive housing, transitional housing and rapid re-housing services available to persons who are experiencing homelessness in the counties identified above.
- Coordinating with other funding resources and homeless programs including HUD Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG), the Veterans Administration, ADOH Housing Trust Funds, Local Housing Authorities and Behavioral Health providers funded through the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS) among others.
- Providing administrative support and coordination for the AZBoSCoC which includes overseeing the AZBoSCoC Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) database, providing HUD required reports, financial oversight of grants, and conducting the annual HUD required Point in Time Survey among others.

## POINT IN TIME (PIT) COUNT METHODOLOGY

The AZBoSCoC has conducted Point in Time Surveys since 2008. Initially under HUD rules, PIT sheltered counts were required annually, but unsheltered counts were only conducted every other year. Beginning in 2015, the AZBoSCoC elected to conduct annual shelter and unsheltered surveys

The annual HUD PIT counts consists of two elements, a sheltered and unsheltered count, to determine the total number of people experiencing homelessness:

- Annual Sheltered Count – As required by HUD, the number of persons who are in emergency shelter, transitional housing and permanent housing must be counted in a single point of time count that takes place annually during the last week of January. In 2018, persons were counted if they were sheltered in transitional or emergency shelter on the night of January 23<sup>rd</sup>.

This count includes all agencies that enter data in the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS). Some agencies, such as domestic violence programs or small pocket shelters do not participate in HMIS. In those cases, ADOH requests information for the count from those individual agencies through a survey. HUD considers only those in emergency shelter and transitional housing as “homeless” for the purposes of the count. While those in permanent housing are also counted to give an overall picture of persons housed by homeless service providers, they are not included in the PIT count.

- Annual Unsheltered Count – HUD also requires CoCs to survey persons who are unsheltered as a part of the PIT. ADOH provides coordination for this effort statewide, but LCEH’s and other coordinators where there is not a LCEH established for the county, provide administrative support and logistics planning at the local level. In 2018, this count occurred between January 24<sup>th</sup> and January 28<sup>th</sup>. Individuals were asked where they had slept the night of January 23<sup>rd</sup>.

### 2018 Methodology Improvements and Changes

- Volunteers and Training - Volunteers are the key resource for completing the point in time count. In 2018, 345 volunteers contributed time and energy to complete the count. This was an increase of almost 30% in the number of volunteer surveyors which resulted in greater coverage and accuracy. The CoC also improved Lead Agency Training for all counties to help standardize volunteer training, gather community feedback on survey tools and processes and identify any concerns in a timely manner. Each county also held its own trainings based on the lead training to ensure consistency. Due to this increased training and coordination, less than 2% of 1,288 collected surveys were incomplete or duplicates.

## FACTORS THAT CAN AFFECT PIT

Every year the AZBoSCoC works to improve the accuracy and reliability of the PIT. In comparing year to year PIT data, other factors may affect data in a given year:

- Survey Methodology – Length of survey, types of questions, survey times can impact willingness of people to participate.
- Number of Volunteers – More volunteers allow for greater geographic coverage and number of people interviewed.
- Volunteer Training and Experience – more familiarity with community and process can expedite surveys and identify more people.
- Weather – Extreme high or low temperatures during survey period may result in higher or lower unsheltered counts as people experiencing homelessness respond to conditions. Volunteers also may be affected by weather.

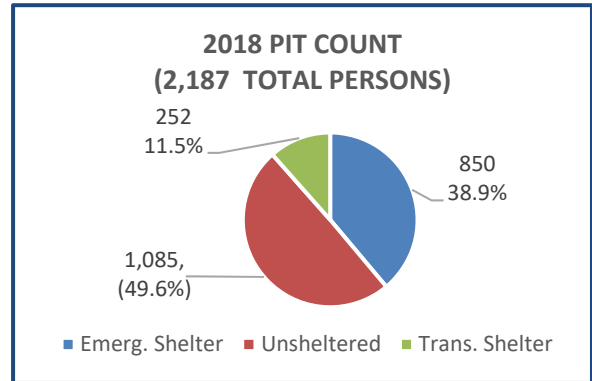


- Extended Survey Window – Based on community feedback, the window for conducting surveys was extended by two days and included a weekend. This allowed more volunteers to participate and to engage new potential homeless persons and populations.
- Simplified Survey – Based on 2017 PIT count volunteer feedback, the VI-SPDAT assessment was removed from the PIT count survey tool. While the VI-SPDAT did gather more client information, the length of time to complete the tool reduced the number of surveys collected and increased the likelihood that some interviewees would not participate due to the additional questions.
- Better HMIS Data Quality – Over the past year, the AZBoSCoC has worked with its HMIS users to improve data quality. Core element data completeness for all HMIS users now exceeds 95%. Improved Data Quality, combined with improved training and processes resulted in more accurate HMIS generated shelter counts.

## 2018 POINT IN TIME HOMELESS COUNT RESULTS

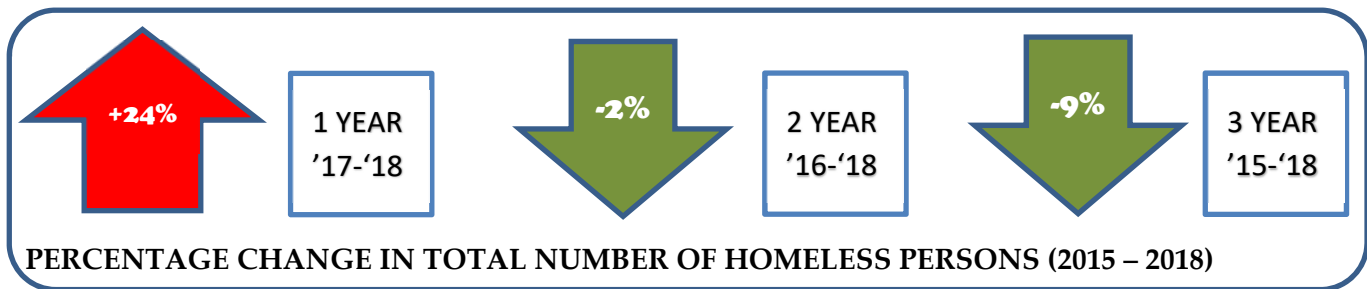
### 2018 OVERALL

The 2018 Arizona Balance of State Point in Time counted **2,187** people experiencing homelessness on January 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2018. This included 1,085 unsheltered persons and 1,102 persons residing in shelters. Of those persons in shelter, 850 were residing in Emergency Shelters and 252 were in Transitional Shelters (TH). Almost half (49.6%) of the total PIT counted persons were unsheltered.



### OVERALL TRENDS (2015 – 2018)

The 2018 PIT showed a 24% increase in persons experiencing homelessness compared to 2017 including a 50% increase in unsheltered persons. While an increase in AZBoSCoC homelessness is not unlikely considering general conditions related to affordable housing, population growth and other trends, the scale of the increase is unexpected and may be influenced by methodology changes between the 2017 and the 2018 PIT Count. As described in the methodology section, in 2017 the AZBoSCoC PIT survey tool was amended to incorporate an additional standardized multi-question assessment (the VI-SPDAT). In 2017 post-PIT debriefings, volunteers and participants commented that the time needed for additional questions reduced the number of people they could survey. It was also reported that some survey participants were reluctant to answer the additional questions. There are additional data points supporting this hypothesis. First, the sheltered count, which did not include the VI-SPDAT, did not change as significantly (a 5% increase) between 2017 and 2018. Second, 2018 PIT numbers are very consistent with PIT count data collected in 2015 and 2016, neither of which involved the VI-SPDAT. Finally, there were no large scale environmental, programmatic, funding or systemic changes in 2017 that would otherwise explain rapid reductions from 2016 to 2017, or increases from 2017 to 2018.

2017 aside, comparing PIT data from 2015 to 2018 shows a positive general trend in overall PIT count numbers. Figure 2 summarizes AZBoSCoC PIT data since 2015 when the AZBoSCoC began annual sheltered and unsheltered PIT counts. Since 2015, the AZBoSCoC has seen an overall 9% reduction in total persons counted in the PIT including a 17% reduction in unsheltered persons experiencing homelessness. While sheltered numbers have remained somewhat consistent (1% decrease), unsheltered persons have decreased 16% in the past three years.

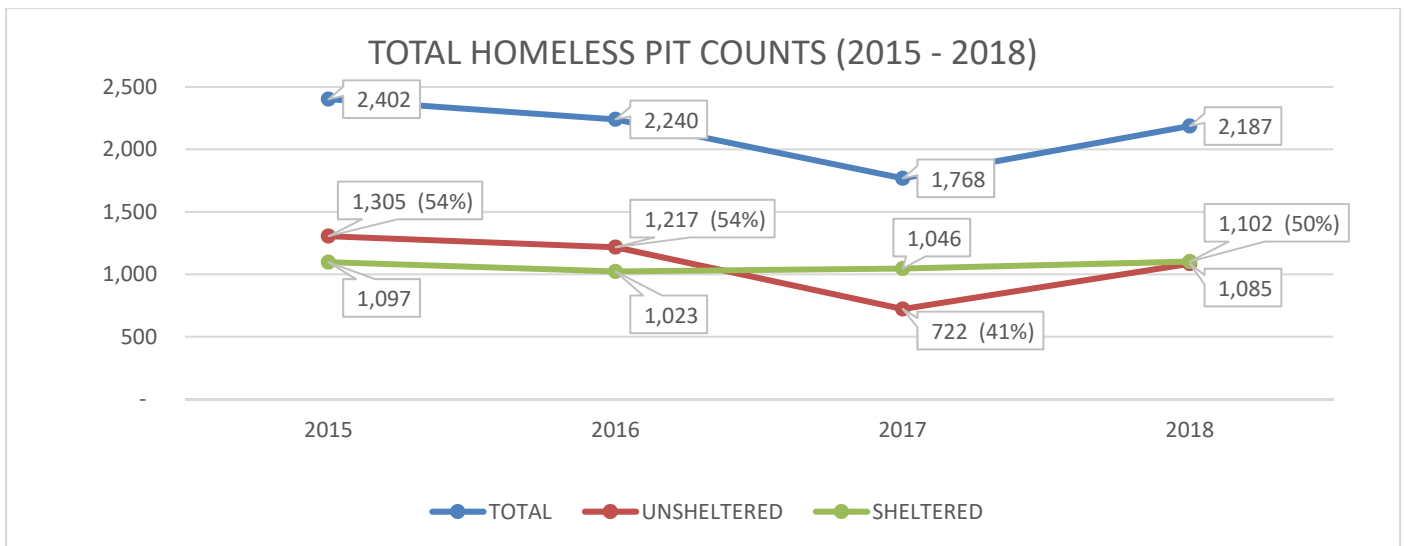

### 2018 HOUSEHOLD COMPOSITION (INDIVIDUALS AND FAMILIES)

The PIT count separates households consisting of families (households with at least one adult and one child); adults (households with no children); and unaccompanied youth (households with only children (see YOUTH Section for Discussion). Within the 2018 PIT County, unaccompanied adults are the largest group accounting for 75% of all homeless persons counted. Families make up the remaining 25% of the population with unaccompanied youth under the age of 18 accounting for less than 1% of the total population surveyed.

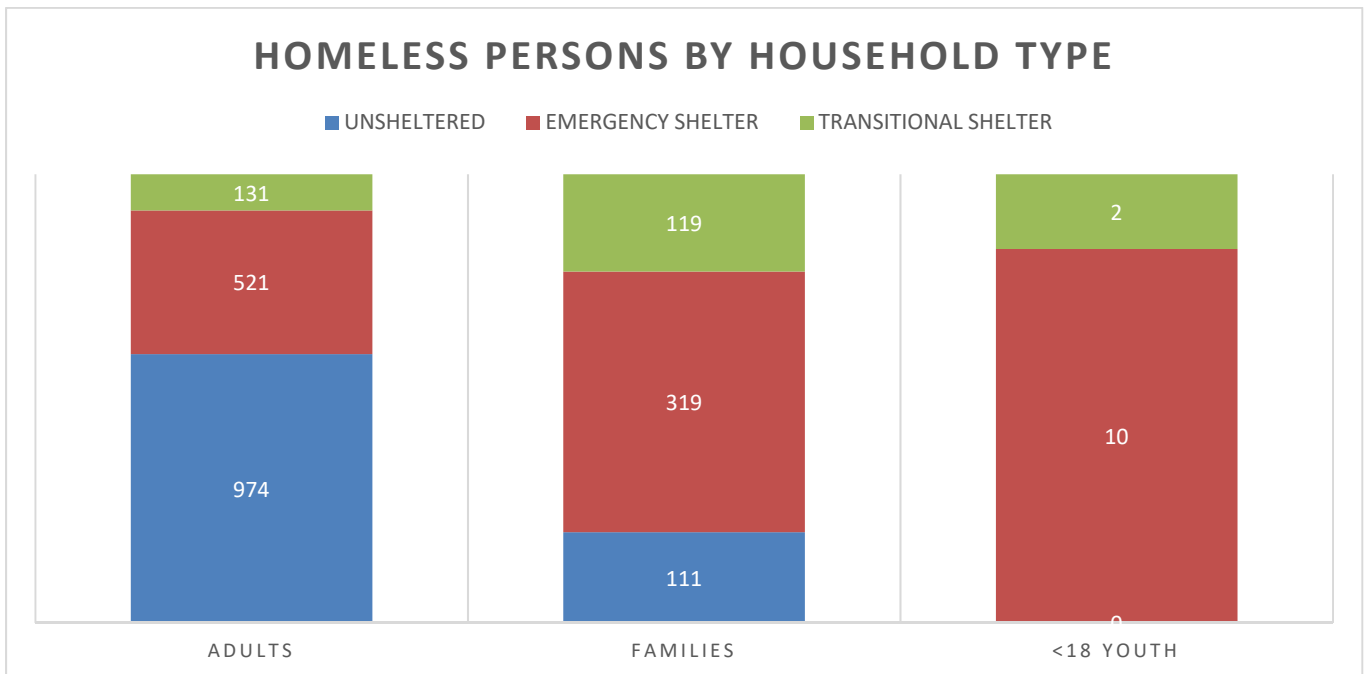
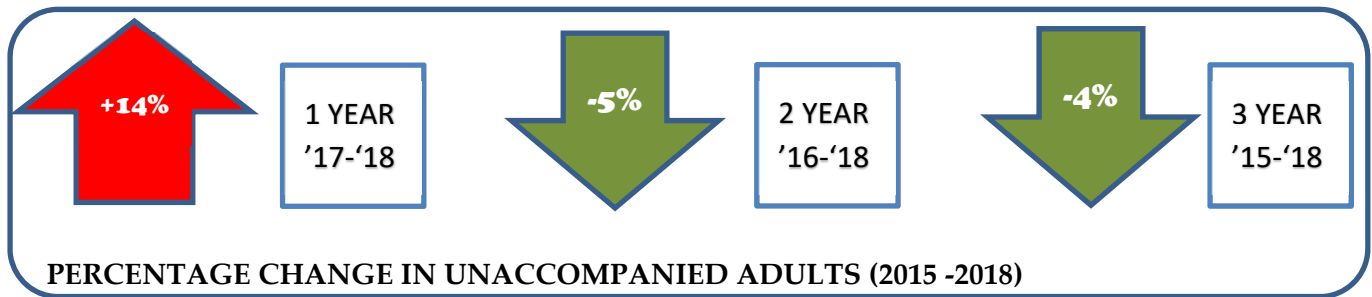

### Unaccompanied Adults

60% of all unaccompanied adults were unsheltered and overall unaccompanied adults represented 90% of the total unsheltered population. While there are a significant number of unaccompanied adult homeless women (519 of 1,626, 32%), the majority of unaccompanied adults are male (1,093 of 1,626,

68%). Unaccompanied men were also slightly more likely to be unsheltered, making up 71% of the unsheltered population. While transgender and/or gender non-conforming persons were a very small number and percentage of the PIT count (12 persons, <1%), it is concerning that all transgender and gender non-conforming persons surveyed were unsheltered. The AZBoSCoC has adopted HUD’s “Equal Access to Housing in HUD Programs regardless of Sexual Orientation or Gender Identity” Guidance and it will be critical going forward to ensure that shelters are adequately meeting the needs of this small but underserved population.



As with the overall numbers, 2017 unaccompanied adults also showed a significant decrease between 2017 and 2018 related to the lower unsheltered count issue described above. Again looking at the longer term trend over the past three years, the overall number of unaccompanied adults has decreased 4%. Moreover, the number and percentage of unsheltered unaccompanied adults has decreased as well by 10%. In regards to gender, unaccompanied men remain the largest group of homeless persons both in shelter and unsheltered. The percentage of homeless unaccompanied women has decreased from comprising 35% of the unaccompanied adult population in 2015 to 32% in the current PIT. As in the 2018 count, transgender unaccompanied adults made up an extremely small number of the PIT count for unaccompanied adults in 2015 (2 persons). This number has increased significantly (500% to 12 persons in 2018) in the past three years justifying the AZBoSCoC monitoring this population more closely and ensuring that shelters and other services are providing programmatically appropriate facilities consistent with the AZBoSCoC’s approved policies.

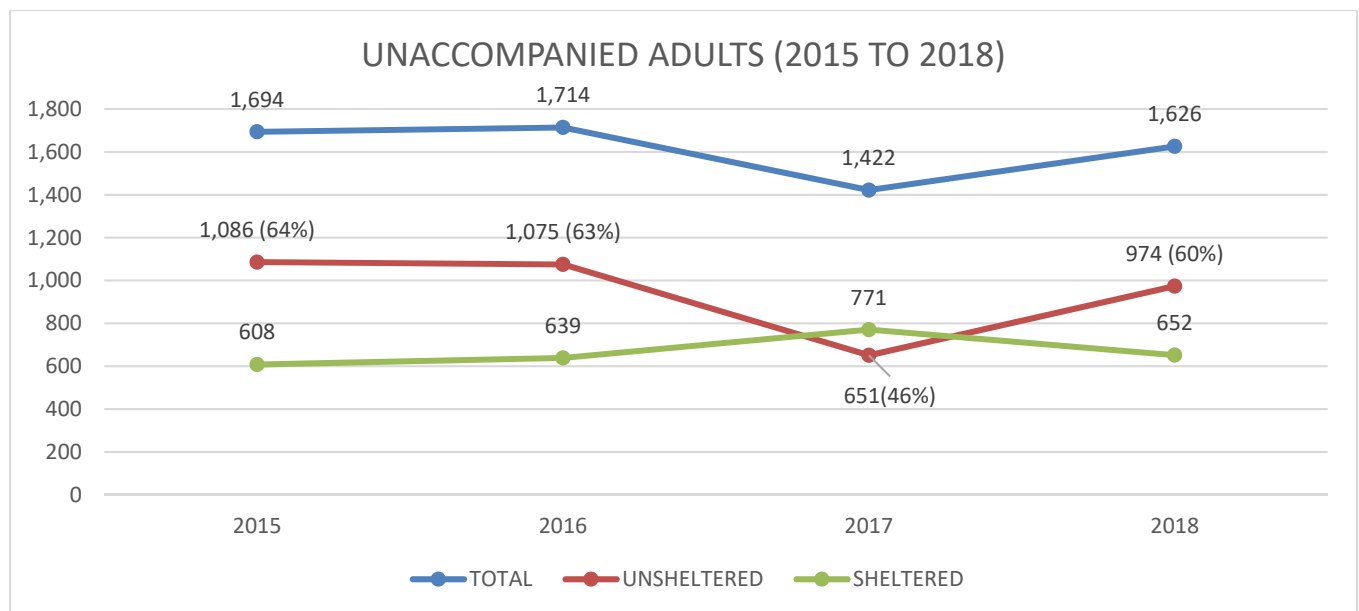
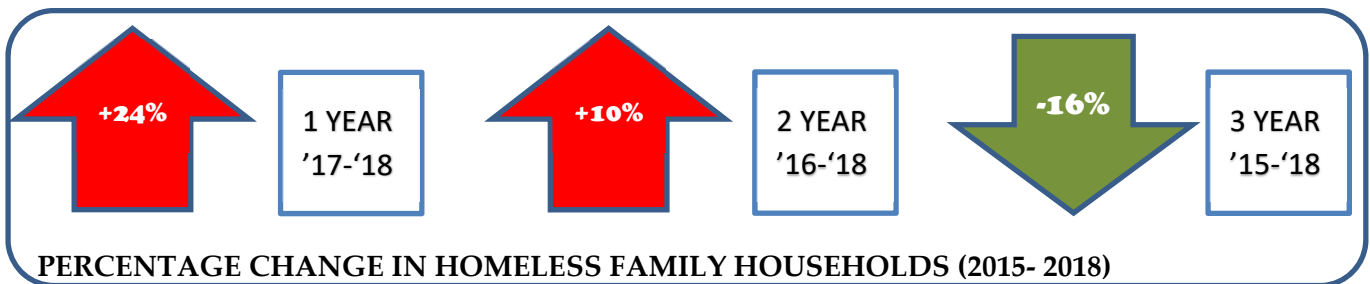

## Families

The 2018 PIT Count identified a total of 169 families consisting of 549 family members. Of the 549 total family members counted, 198 were adults/parents and 351 were children under the age of 18. The average family size was three persons. Unlike for unaccompanied adults, the majority of homeless family households (82%) were sheltered. The larger number of sheltered families is partly attributable to the fact that 40% of the identified emergency and transitional shelter beds in the AZBoSCoC are for survivors of domestic violence and predominately serve women and children. Females make up a higher percentage (41%) of the family population again due to availability of DV resources. As with unaccompanied adults, there are a small number of transgender/gender non-conforming (6) persons. While not all transgender/gender non-conforming persons in families were unsheltered, the majority (5, 83%) were. This will continue to be an item for ongoing monitoring as with unaccompanied adults.



The 2018 PIT Count shows the AZBoSCoC's success in reducing the number of homeless families shown in the PIT count. As with other comparisons of 2017 PIT data to prior and subsequent years, the methodology reducing the number of completed surveys exaggerates the decreases from 2017 to 2018, and increases from 2017 to 2018. A more accurate trend can be established looking at data from 2015 to the present which show the number of homeless households with children is down 16% since 2015. Similarly, the number of persons in homeless families also decreased (19%) between 2015 and 2018 further contributing to the overall reduction in homeless persons counted in the 2018 PIT compared to 2015. The majority of this decrease results from a 48% decrease in the number of unsheltered homeless family households between 2015 and 2018. The reduction in homeless families is one area in which we may be able to attribute the reduction in numbers directly to improved interventions and new resources. In late 2016, ADOH awarded \$1,000,000 in funding for Rapid Re-Housing projects in the Arizona Balance of State. This program further complimented new and re-allocated Rapid Re-Housing resources from DES Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG), the Continuum of Care, and the VA's Supportive Services for Veteran Families. Since 2015, the AZBoSCoC has seen a 48% increase in the number of persons showing as housed in the annual Housing Inventory Counts performed in conjunction with the PIT. The AZBoSCoC will continue to track the number of homeless families to validate the impact of these strategies on reducing the number of homeless families.

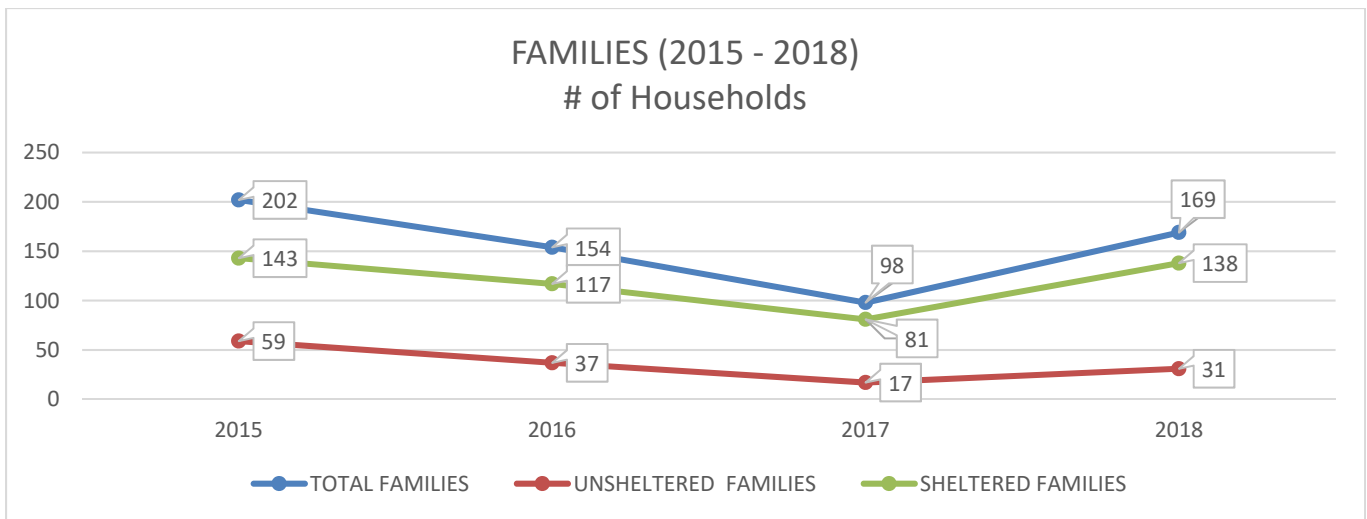

### RECOMMENDATIONS – OVERALL/UNACCOMPANIED ADULTS AND FAMILIES

Goal: The ongoing goal of the AZBoSCoC is to reduce the overall number of persons experiencing homelessness, especially the number of unsheltered persons.

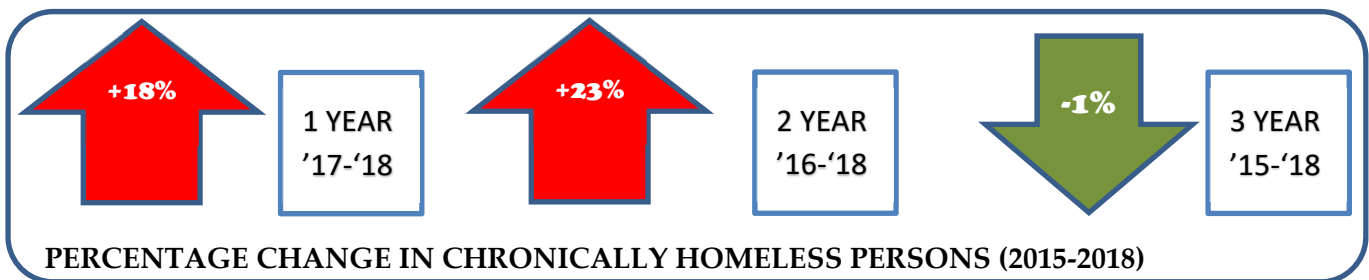
- Target long-term shelter stayers (over 100 days) to reduce average shelter length of stay. This could increase shelter bed turnover and allow current bed capacity to serve more people to reduce unsheltered homelessness.
- Implement coordinated/standardized diversion and prevention strategies to reduce the numbers of new persons experiencing homelessness.
- Continue to track progress made on reducing number of homeless families to ensure ongoing success of RRH strategies
- Implementation of ADOH Housing Locator Services and Landlord Incentive Program to increase availability of permanent housing to shorten housing search times for those in RRH and permanent housing programs.
- Continue to improve PIT count coverage and methodology to ensure all persons experiencing homelessness are included. Compare PIT to other data sources including HUD system performance measures to better target interventions and responses.

## 2018 POINT IN TIME SPECIAL POPULATIONS

### CHRONIC HOMELESSNESS (CH) IN AZBOSCOC

Under HUD definitions, a person is defined as chronically homeless if they: 1) have one or more disabling condition/s (e.g. mental illness, physical disability, and/or substance abuse); and 2) they have been homeless for 12 months or more consecutively; or they have four episodes of homelessness in the past three years totaling 12 or more months in duration. Studies of chronic homeless and other high acuity disabled populations have demonstrated that while representing a relatively small portion of the overall homeless population, usually about 20%, they account for a significant portion of the cost and effort associated with serving homeless persons. These high costs include frequent emergency services contacts, behavioral health costs, hospitalization and incarceration due to the severity of their disabilities and likelihood of not receiving homeless services. Chronic homelessness began to be tracked in the PIT count in 2014.

In the 2018, AZBoSCoC PIT Count, 537 persons were identified as “chronically homeless” based upon the duration and frequency of their homelessness and their self-reporting of having at least one disabling condition. This represented a quarter of all persons counted in the PIT. As has been shown in numerous studies, chronic persons in the AZBoS are far more likely to be unsheltered since their disabilities including substance abuse and mental health often make them ineligible or they are unable to access shelter due to difficult to follow rules or eligibility criteria. Eighty-nine percent (89%) of identified chronically homeless persons were unsheltered. While representing about 25% of all homeless persons identified in the PIT count, chronically homeless persons made up almost half of the unsheltered homeless population. Ninety-eight (98%) of all chronic homeless persons in the 2018 PIT count were unaccompanied adults. The PIT does not track the gender or other demographic characteristics of the chronic population at this time.



### HISTORICAL COMPARISONS/TRENDS – CHRONIC

In the 2018 PIT Count, 537 persons were identified as chronically homeless. 2018 showed an 18% increase in identified chronically homeless persons compared to 2017. As noted throughout this document, a portion of the increase may be attributed to the change in survey methodology between 2017 and 2018. The 2017 unsheltered chronic count may have also been impacted by unusually cold temperatures in northern Arizona during the 2017 PIT count week. Due to the cold temperatures, Flagstaff in particular reduced access barriers and provided temporary emergency weather relief capacity to ensure that all persons escaping the weather had access to shelter. This significantly reduced the unsheltered numbers in these communities as well as the numbers of chronically homeless individuals who were able to get off of the street during the PIT week. Comparing 2018 to 2015, when AZBoSCoC began annual sheltered and unsheltered counts, the number of chronic persons has remained essentially unchanged (>1%). While the number of chronic persons has not changed significantly in three years, the number of chronic

homeless persons who are sheltered has increased slightly in number. Since 2015, between 85 to 96% of chronically homeless persons surveyed have been unsheltered and chronically homeless persons have consistently comprised a disproportionate ratio of the unsheltered population identified in the PIT as shown here:

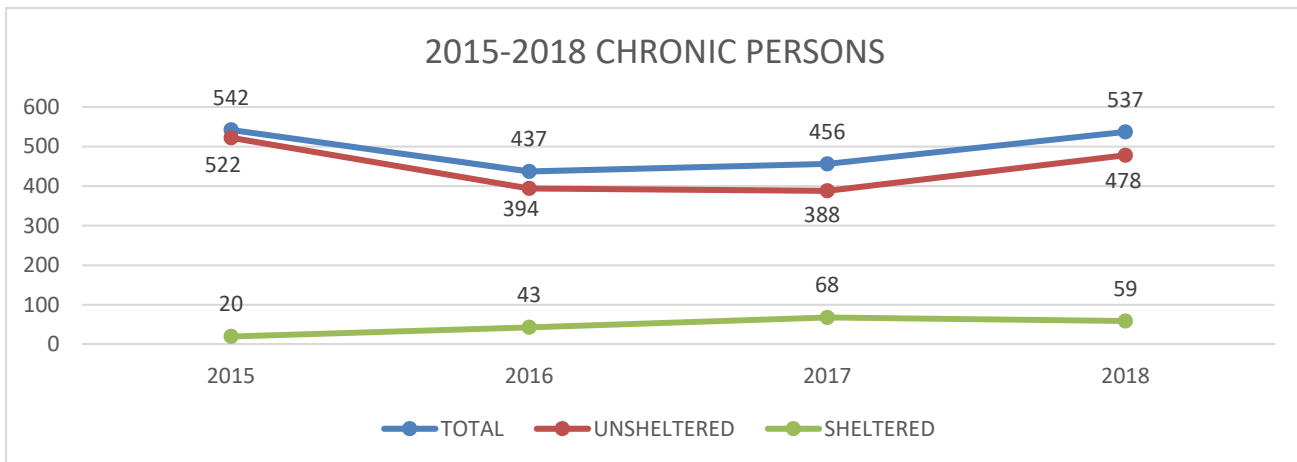

This lack of improvement in the number and percentage of chronic unsheltered homeless persons is particularly concerning to the AZBoSCoC. For the past three years, Chronic Homeless persons have been one of the target populations prioritized for permanent supportive housing (PSH) units in the AZBoSCoC in order to meet the severe services needs of this CH population. To this end, over the past three years, the AZBoSCoC has done the following to prioritize CH persons for PSH units: 1) the Governance Advisory Board adopted HUD Rule 16-11 Order of Prioritization for PSH in which CH is the top priority population for any vacant PSH units in the AZBoSCoC; 2) the Governance Advisory Board established policy that turnover units in all PSH units, not just CH dedicated units, must be prioritized for CH persons consistent with HUD Rule 16-11; and 3) the percentage of beds filled by CH persons is a scoring criteria for all CoC projects in the annual NOFA process to incentivize targeting of resources to chronic individuals. The lack of progress in reducing CH persons both in real numbers and as a percentage of all clients in the PIT despite dedicating scarce existing Permanent Housing capacity to do so is frustrating but can be understood by analyzing the availability of Permanent Housing resources in the AZBoSCoC.

Despite efforts to increase CH housing placement rates, the following chart shows the total number of non-veteran beds, the number of dedicated chronically homeless beds and the number of VASH beds each since 2015. Between 2016 and 2017, the AZBoSCoC approved a policy that all PH beds in the CoC were required to be dedicated for CH persons, regardless of their contract. As a result, the number of beds counted in the 2018 Housing Inventory Chart for chronically homeless is 564, which is a 26.7% increase from 2017. Overall, the chart shows two key factors; 1) while the number of CH dedicated beds has increased, the total number of PH beds in the AZBoSCoC has stayed level or even decreased; and 2) the majority of new PH beds have been VASH vouchers limited to homeless veterans and not necessarily prioritized for CH individuals.



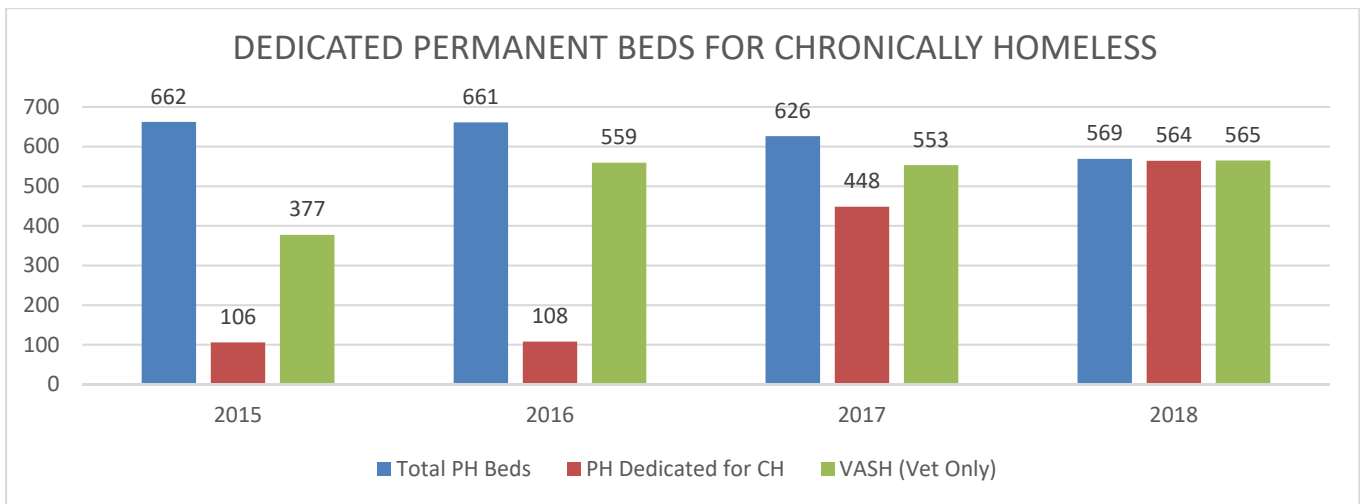

While permanent housing capacity has been prioritized for chronically homeless persons and has increased as described above, the number of CoC permanent housing capacity is extremely limited and has not increased substantially to meet the need.

- Since 2014, the AZBoSCoC Housing Inventory Count (HIC) shows that other than veteran VASH permanent housing beds, the AZBoSCoC has not added any significant numbers of permanent housing beds to meet the demand for non-veteran PH housing for chronically homeless persons despite the increase in PIT CH numbers. VASH beds are not currently prioritized exclusively for CH veterans as are CoC beds and the majority of CH persons are not veterans.
- While no new permanent housing beds were added for non-veterans, retention and occupancy in existing permanent housing units has remained extremely high. Occupancy in AZBoSCoC permanent housing programs exceeds 93% and a large number of persons have been in their PSH unit for long periods of time (over 3 years). This significantly reduces the turnover units available for new CH placements which average approximately 12 open units a month.
- The current tight rental housing market has made it difficult to find affordable, habitable rental units especially for CH persons who are likely to have criminal backgrounds, poor rental histories and other barriers to renting in a competitive market. A number of landlords have decided not to accept VASH or other HUD subsidy programs due to the rapidly increasing rental rates and the perceived burden of working with CH persons with disabilities or other barriers.

## RECOMMENDATIONS – CHRONIC HOMELESSNESS

Goal: The AZBoSCoC has approved and adopted policies and strategies to allocate resources to reduce the number unsheltered and total number of chronically homeless persons in the PIT. In addition to maintaining current strategies, the following additional considerations are recommended.

- Move On Strategies – ADOH has been working with CoC and other permanent housing providers to identify strategies for current permanent housing residents who have demonstrated housing stability to move onto other mainstream housing programs (ex: Public Housing Authority Housing Choice Vouchers) or less intensive housing programs so that CoC Permanent Housing capacity can be focused on those CH persons on the street.
- Improved Coordinated Entry and Housing Prioritization – AZBoSCoC now has by name lists of identified homeless persons for each county in the AZBoSCoC. These lists include those identified as

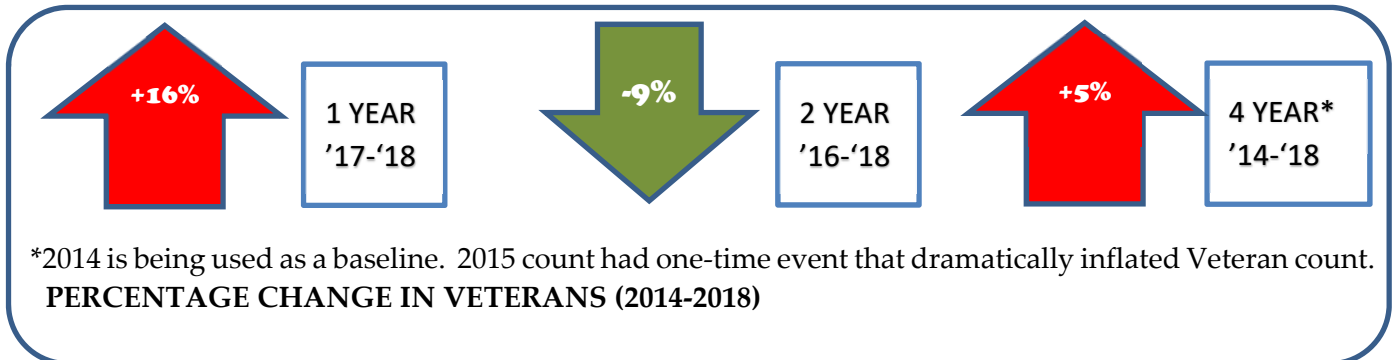
chronically homeless. This should make it easier to identify and prioritize eligible chronically homeless persons when permanent housing units are available.

- Ensuring benefit and/or earned income for persons currently in PH to allow for resident to pay more towards their rent or transition out of subsidized PH units to increase turnover or stretch subsidies.
- Monitoring – ADOH as the collaborative applicant responsible for CoC project monitoring will be reviewing permanent housing placement data for all CoC projects to ensure that they are filled with chronically homeless persons consistent with the overall AZBoSCoC prioritization policies.
- Work with Veterans’ VASH programs to prioritize VASH PH beds for chronically homeless veterans who make up approximately 18% of identified chronic population.

**VETERANS**

The 2018 Point in Time identified 277 total homeless veterans of which 170 (61%) were unsheltered. This figure included 8 veteran family households (with 13 additional non-veteran family members). The majority of homeless veterans (88%) were men of which 62% were unsheltered. Women veterans were the remaining 12% of the veteran population of which 53% were unsheltered. There was one transgendered veteran identified and as with other transgendered populations, was unsheltered. There were eight (8) veteran households with children identified that included nine (9) veterans and 22 family members. Over 97% of veterans were unaccompanied adults. Ninety-five (95), over a third (34%) of homeless veterans, also met the definition of chronic homelessness. The vast majority of these chronically homeless veterans (97%) were unsheltered. Veterans comprised 18% of the total number of chronically homeless persons identified in the 2018 PIT Count.

**HISTORICAL COMPARISONS/TRENDS – VETERANS (2015-2018)**



HUD began requiring the count to include veterans in 2014. The below chart provides an overview of veterans counted since 2014 when AZBoSCoC began annual sheltered and unsheltered counts. 2014 is used to provide a baseline for veterans since it was the first year veterans were counted, and because 2015 veteran numbers were an outlier due to a documented one-time event involving a gathering of a large number of unsheltered veterans in a single county during the PIT count. Resources were allocated to this issue and the overall veteran numbers have not been that large since.

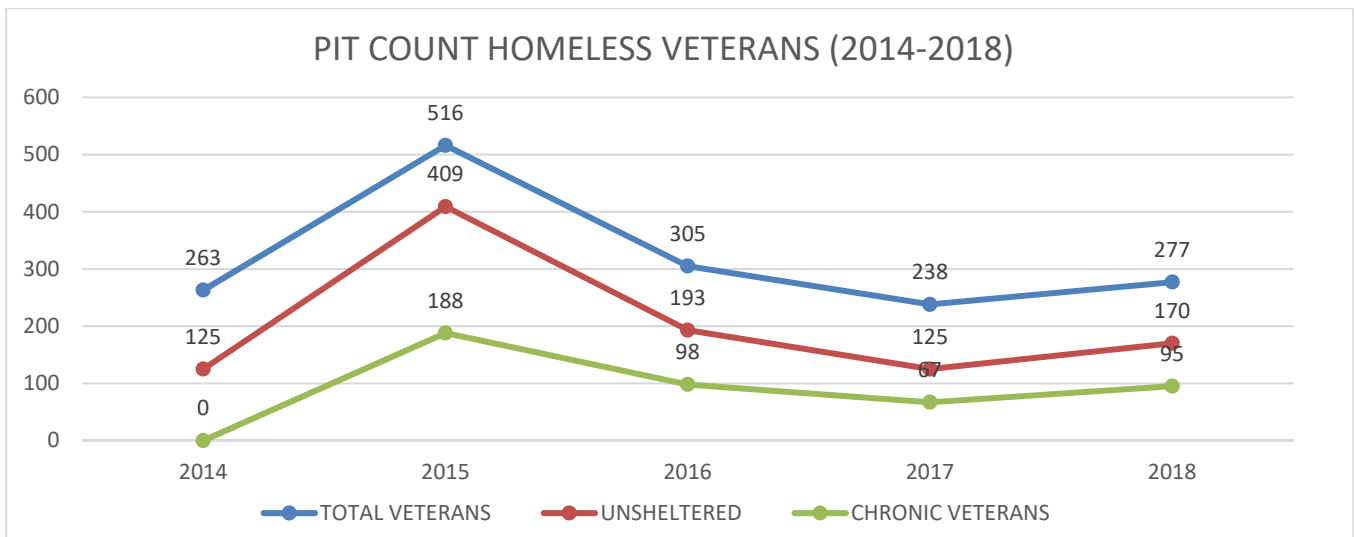

As with chronically homeless persons, homeless veterans have been a priority of the AZBoSCoC for the past four years. Despite this focus, the number of homeless veterans has not changed significantly in the past five years other than the efforts around the one-time event in 2015. This lack of movement is particularly concerning considering the influx of veteran housing and supportive service resources to serve this population including VASH Permanent Housing Vouchers and Supportive Service for Veteran Families resources (Prevention and Rapid Re-Housing for Veterans). The following chart indicates the number of permanent housing beds and the utilization for the night of the count in the particular year.

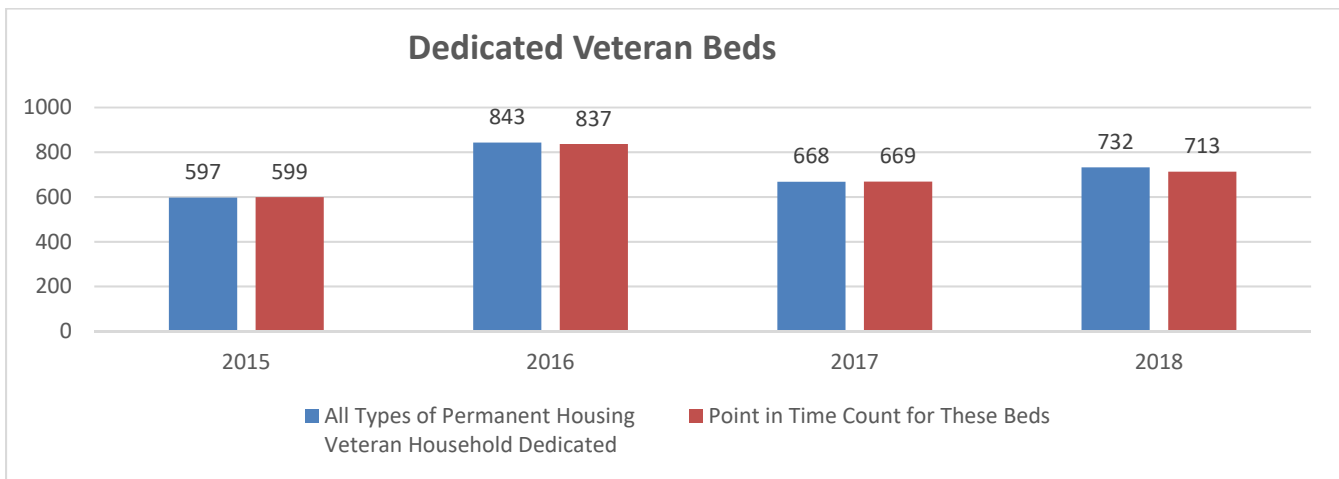

As Indicated:

- There has been an increasing emphasis to house veteran households. Between 2013 and 2016, the AZBoSCoC saw an increase in resources such as VASH (Veteran focused housing vouchers) and SSVF/RRH options for veterans.
- There was approximately a 400% increase in the number of beds available for veterans between 2013 and 2016. In 2017, there was a 20% decrease in the number of beds included in the housing inventory. In 2018, there was a 9.5% increase in the number of dedicated Veteran beds.

It should also be noted that the number and percentage of chronically homeless veterans has remained constant at around 100 persons and 30+% of the veteran population. The vast majority of this population is unsheltered (97%).

## **RECOMMENDATIONS - VETERANS**

Goal: Homeless veterans have been a priority of HUD as well as the Veterans Administration for the past five years. This has resulted in additional resources from the Veterans Administration and prioritization within the AZBoSCoC. While this has had some success, it has not led to significant reductions in the number of homeless veterans. The following additional strategies are recommended.

- The Northern and Southern Area Veteran Administration Health Care Systems (NAVAHCS and SAVAHCS) have hired VA Coordinated Entry Specialist positions to coordinate with AZBoSCoC local Coordinated Entry and LCEH groups to better coordinate care and prioritize veteran services and resources.
- The AZBoSCoC has established a standing Veteran Committee working group including all VAHCS systems, SSVF providers, the AZ Department of Veteran Affairs and other veteran service providers to improve coordination of services and housing resources for AZBoSCoC veterans
- The Committee has adopted and is implementing the VA/USICH Benchmarks and Criteria for Ending Veteran Homelessness to establish clear targets and strategies for reducing the numbers of homeless veterans in the AZBoSCoC.
- Veterans (especially chronic veterans) should continue to be a priority population within the AZBoSCoC coordinated entry prioritization policy. The AZBoSCoC will work with VA to prioritize VASH vouchers for chronically homeless.
- Veteran housing providers can participate in AZBoSCoC programs including landlord incentive and housing locator programs to increase stock of affordable housing for subsidy programs to expedite housing placement in VASH and SSVF programs.

## **UNACCOMPANIED YOUTH (INCLUDING 18 – 24 YEAR OLDS)**

For HUD Point in Time purposes, unaccompanied youth include not only persons under the age of 18, but young adults between the ages of eighteen and twenty-four. Based on this definition, the 2018 PIT Count identified a total of 144 youth (7% of the total 2018 PIT Count) of which 80 (55%) were unsheltered. Youth gender aligned closely with overall homeless gender demographics (Male- 52%, Female 33%) with one major exception. Transgender/gender non-conforming youth represented 5% of all youth. While this is a low percentage of all homeless persons, it represents over 40% of all Transgender/Gender Non-Conforming persons identified in the 2018 PIT. All eight (8) of these individuals, 100%, were unsheltered. Substantial literature exists showing that unsheltered homeless youth are a very vulnerable population, but these risks are even more acute for transgendered individuals. One positive data point, (10) unaccompanied minors (under 18 years of age) were identified and all of these persons were sheltered, mainly in our limited youth resources in the AZBoSCoC. Additionally, one (1) family household (parent with at least one child) headed by a youth under age 18 was also identified. This youth headed household was also sheltered. 76% of homeless youth identified were unaccompanied individuals between the ages of 18 to 24. The majority, 57%, were unsheltered. There were also a small number of family households with parents under the age of 24 identified. Overall seven (7) of the 119 youth households surveyed (6%) were family units with youth parents (under the age of 24). Twenty-six (26) homeless youth were identified as chronically homeless (18%) which is slightly lower than other population groups. All identified chronically homeless youth were unaccompanied individuals. As with other populations, chronically homeless youth are predominately unsheltered (92%). Again research on homeless youth populations suggest that the chronic definition does not adequately capture the acuity and risk for homeless youth since many have not had long homeless experiences due to their age/youth despite

having significant acuity. It has also been substantiated that those youth who do meet the chronic definition are exceptionally acute in their needs and vulnerability.

**HISTORICAL COMPARISONS/TRENDS – UNACCOMPANIED YOUTH (2015-2018)**



Due to the relatively low numbers of unaccompanied youth and the lack of dedicated youth resources in the AZBoSCoC, unaccompanied youth have not been explicitly prioritized in the AZBoSCoC although programs have always ensured children under the age of 18 are connected to shelter or appropriate programs and services. The following charts show the numbers of homeless youth identified in the PIT count between 2015 and 2018 as well as the age break out between youth under the age of 18 and 18-24 year olds. While there has been some minor changes from year to year, the overall numbers remain low and essentially unchanged. While the low numbers make comparison of years difficult, since 2015 the total number of unaccompanied youth including youth headed households has decreased 5%. There are two additional trends that should be noted for ongoing evaluation. First, the number of female unaccompanied youth seems to be going down. In 2015, female unaccompanied youth represented approximately 45% of homeless unaccompanied youth including head of youth family households. In 2018, this percentage has decreased to 37%. At this point there are no obvious programmatic changes or improvements that would explain this change and it will be important to monitor this trend going forward to determine if it is related to any other issues such as domestic violence or racial disparities. Second, the percentage of unsheltered unaccompanied youth counted in 2018 exceeded 50% for the first time since 2015. Again this will need to be monitored to see if it is a one year aberration due to possible survey changes or one-time events, or part of a larger trends related to adverse unintentional service or policy changes.

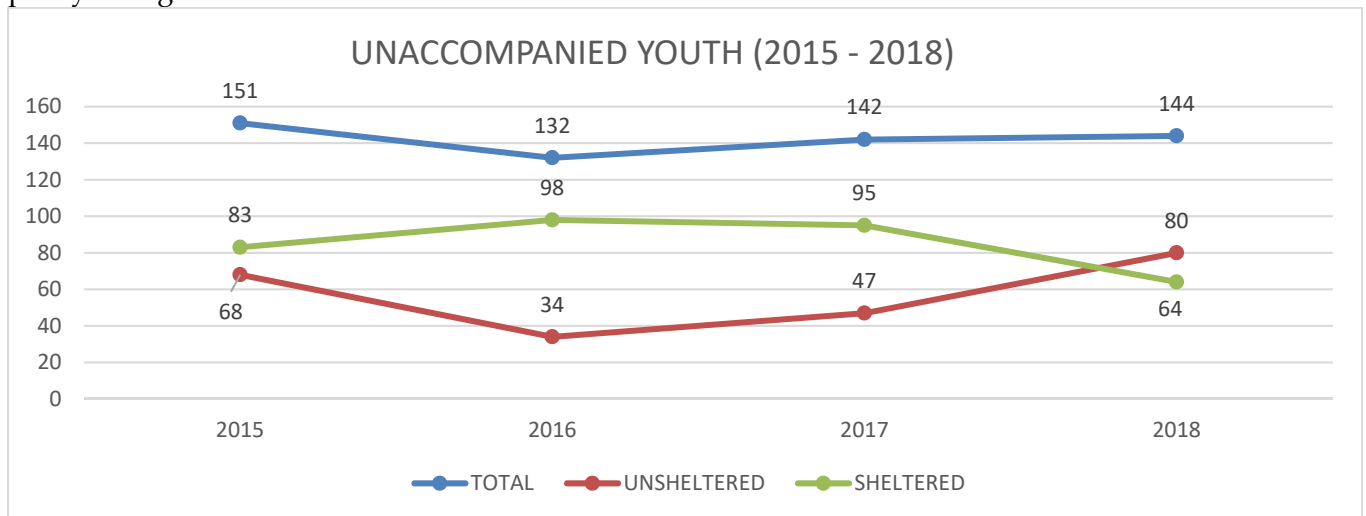

Figure 11 below compares data from 2015 to 2018 related to the number of unaccompanied homeless youth by age groups (18-24 and under 18) as well as the number of households with children headed by

an unaccompanied youth. In general, young adults (18-24 years old) comprise a greater percentage of the unaccompanied youth population making up over 80% of the total number of homeless unaccompanied youth. This percentage has increased from 59% in 2015. Correspondingly, the percentage of unaccompanied youth under the age of 18 has decreased. The number of homeless youth headed family households has also decreased since 2015. Chronically homeless youth were counted until 2017. At this point it is difficult to identify any trends due to the limited amount of data, but this will be a priority for further evaluation going forward.

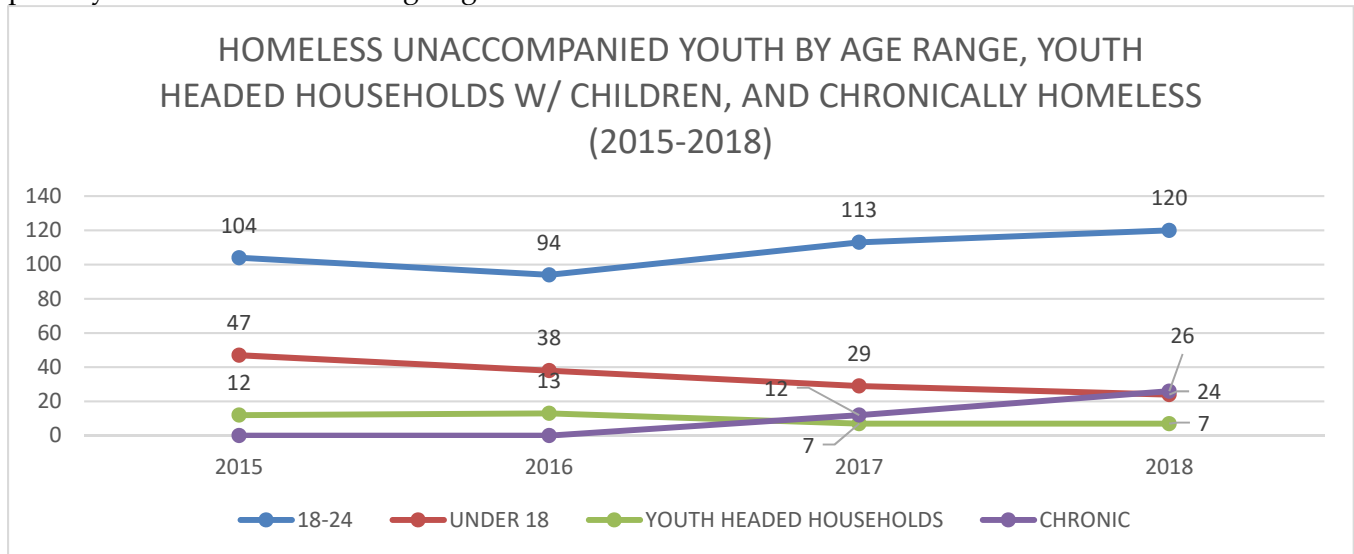

## RECOMMENDATIONS – UNACCOMPANIED YOUTH

Goal: While youth have not been a priority to date due to relatively small numbers, the high level of vulnerability and the possibility of early intervention preventing long-term homelessness, suggests increased prioritization and focus on the youth population, especially those under the age of 18 and youth headed family households. The relatively small numbers also suggest that prioritization would not interfere significantly with other existing priorities for housing resources such as chronically homeless or veterans.

Key strategies will include:

- Add youth, particularly chronically homeless youth and those under the age of 18, as priorities for AZBoSCoC housing resources.
- Youth/age is already included as a sortable field in the AZBoSCoC By-Name List to more rapidly identify and engage youth in local Coordinated Entry case conferencing.
- AZBoSCoC will coordinate with the AZ Department of Education McKinney Vento Liaison and local school district liaisons to: 1) incorporate school district information and participation into CoC and Coordinated Entry to better identify homeless youth; 2) to coordinate AZBoSCoC housing resources with prevention and other resources provided through schools; and 3) to improve PIT methodology to better count homeless youth.
- The AZBoSCoC will review proposal to establish Homeless Youth Advisory Group to incorporate additional youth providers, youth with lived experience of homelessness, and other mainstream providers serving youth to improve coordination and potentially explore securing HUD Homeless Demonstration Funds to develop youth focused CoC project(s)/service capacity.

## HOUSING INVENTORY COUNT

As part of the PIT process, the AZBoSCoC is also required to complete a Housing Inventory Chart (HIC) to identify all of the available Emergency Shelter, Transitional Housing, Rapid Re-Housing and Permanent Supportive Housing capacity available in the Continuum of Care as well as the occupancy of these units at the time of the PIT count. The HIC includes both projects utilizing HMIS as well as non HMIS projects (including DV units) surveyed during the PIT. This is a useful tool to compare to PIT counts to establish a rough estimate of the current need being met, identify any underutilized resources and establish a simple estimate of the housing gaps needed to meet the unsheltered need shown in the corresponding PIT count. The following table provides an overview of the number of projects, number of beds and how many beds were occupied at the point in time date from 2013-2017. This information includes all types of projects.

### Considerations:

- The number of projects fluctuates from year to year as new projects were added or consolidated. In addition, projects that do not participate in HMIS fluctuate as well. Projects may not provide information each year. As an example, HUD required that the Veterans' Domiciliary (in Prescott) be included in prior year counts but excluded it for the count in 2016 and future years.
- Total number of beds may include beds that were added to accommodate seasonal needs (i.e. winter/summer specific beds, overflow).
- While there may be minor fluctuations from year to year, in general the number and bed capacity within the AZBoSCoC remains somewhat stable. Overtime, the AZBoSCoC has demonstrated increased occupancy levels to maximize these limited resources.
- Presently, over 90% of non DV Permanent Housing, Rapid Re-Housing and Transitional Housing projects, and over 80% of all Emergency Shelter beds identified in the HIC participate in HMIS through the AZBoSCoC.

HIC information is sorted by project type, emergency shelter (ES), transitional housing (TH), Rapid Re-Housing (RRH) and Permanent Housing (PH). Special population beds including veterans, youth and domestic violence are included. Persons and beds are counted regardless of whether the program received funding from HUD or not. The breakout of resources and utilization by project type are as follows:

- Across project type, utilization rates were high. Transitional housing had the lowest at 84%. As was stated earlier.
  - Transitional housing information has some associated caveats. There are four HUD funded projects that were still classified as transitional housing at the time of the count. Since then, two of those projects have been reallocated to permanent supportive housing and two to rapid rehousing. These project reallocations will impact the sheltered count in upcoming years.
  - A significant portion of AZBoSCoC transitional capacity is targeted to persons experiencing DV. These units have lower utilization rates than other interventions.
- With the addition of RRH units dedicated to Veterans, this type of housing has increased in the AZBoSCoC. Best practices show it to be an important part of the continuum.
- All types of permanent housing are being utilized effectively throughout the continuum.

**RECOMMENDATIONS – HOUSING INVENTORY CHART**

- The AZBoSCoC is working with all identified HIC projects to have 100% participation in AZBoSCoC coordination activities including Coordinated Entry, HMIS and housing prioritization to maximize utilization.
- There are no obvious anticipated sources of increased shelter or housing funds through the HUD CoC Process to meet existing system needs. Therefore to increase housing to meet the service gap shown between the HIC and PIT counts, the AZBoSCoC will need to:
  - Incorporate housing and supportive services from other systems of care that serve homeless persons including the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS), criminal justice system and/or crisis services.
  - Utilize AZBoSCoC HUD System Performance Data to evaluate and improve service coordination within shelter programs to shorten shelter stays by connecting persons to non-homeless housing and community based resources. This could potentially increase turnover of shelter beds and increase capacity within existing homeless programs
  - Enhance prevention and diversion practices to reduce the number of persons entering or experiencing homelessness for the first time in both shelters and on the street.



## UNSHELTERED COUNT

As described in the Methodology section above, Arizona conducted the unsheltered count during the third week in January 2018. Persons were interviewed for the count from all thirteen counties in the continuum except Santa Cruz. There were coordinators in each county who recruited, organized and trained 345 volunteers to conduct the count. This was a significant increase over the 247 volunteers who participated in 2017. Volunteer training was also enhanced in 2018. Volunteers participated in training conducted locally. Unlike the shelter count which is drawn from HMIS, the unsheltered survey includes additional AZBoSCoC data collection questions to assist us in better understanding the unsheltered population in our communities. These additional, not PIT required questions provide some interesting insight and issues of focus. The following discussion focuses on some of the key additional information gained through the unsheltered count.

A total of 902 surveys were included in the final unsheltered count. An additional 362 surveys were collected from individuals who were sheltered the night of the count. Surveys that were not used in the final unsheltered count included individuals who reported that they had spent the previous night in a shelter, in a friend’s home, or in a motel room among others. Surveys that did not provide sufficient information were also not included. Only persons who slept in a place not meant for human habitation, such as a car, on the street, in a riverbed, in the forest or some similar location were counted. In 2018, persons were counted in 12 of the 13 counties in the AZBoSCoC geographic region. The following provides an overview of the surveys collected by county:

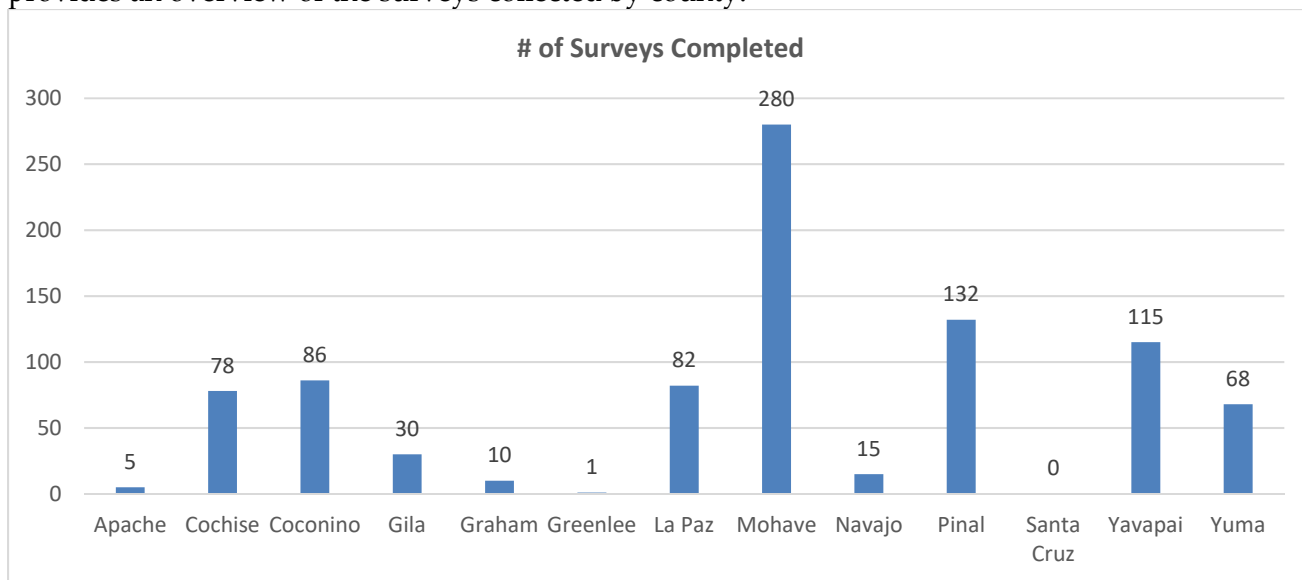

The 902 households included in the survey had a total of 1,085 individuals in those households. This is an increase of 50.2% from 2017. The majority of persons were single person households. The following provides an overview by type of household. In 2018 there were no unaccompanied youth counted (i.e. youth under 18 without an adult.)

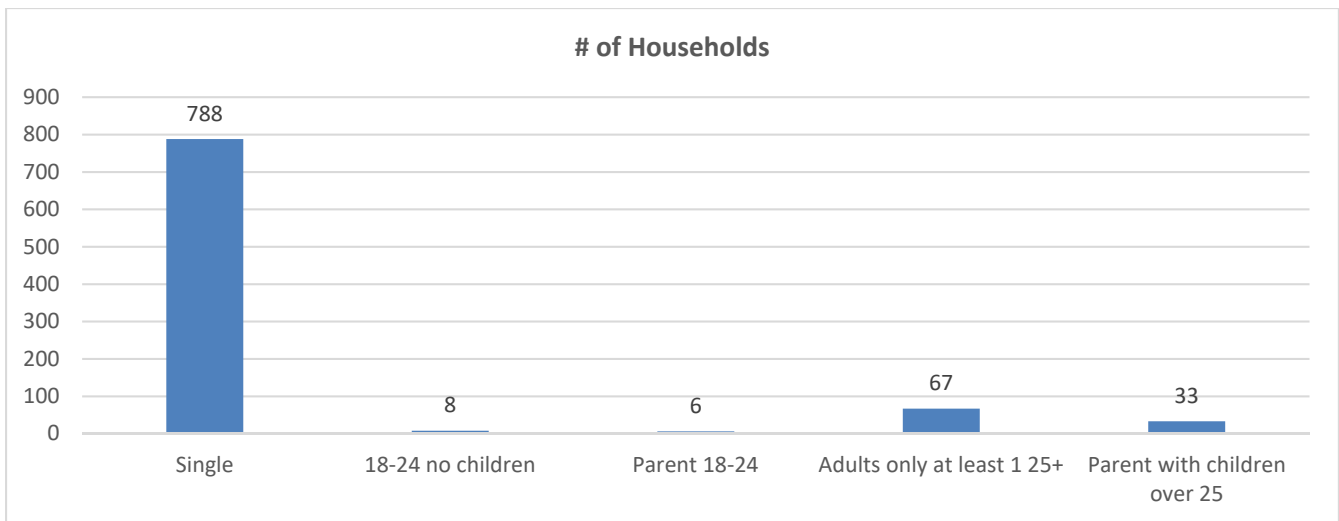

Persons slept in a variety of locations on the night before they participated in the count. The majority of persons were camping out in the forest, mountains or desert, staying in a vehicle or were on the streets. The following provides a summary of where individuals indicated that they spent the night before the count:

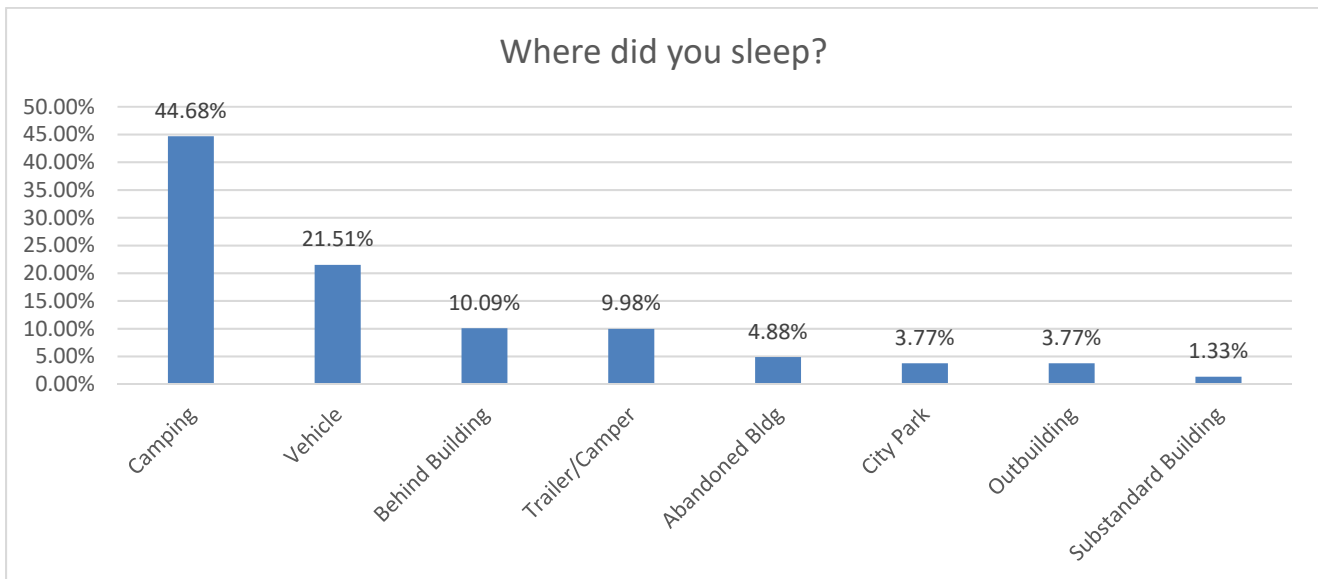

### Demographics

- 87.19% of all persons included in the survey were over 24; 7.28% were between 18 and 24, and 5.53% were under 18. Nearly half (45.54%) of all persons were between the ages of 45 and 64.
- The majority of individuals were male (69.31%), with females being 28.94%. Less than 2% of individuals counted identified as transgender or non-conforming.
- 15.67% of all individuals in households were Hispanic.
- The majority of persons in households identified as White (79.61%) followed by Native Americans (12.90%), many races (5.16%), African American (1.94). A small percentage of individuals identified as Asian (0.09%), and Hawaiian (0.28%).

### Other Factors

- The majority of persons (63.4%) have experienced homelessness for 12 or more months. The next highest category was those persons who experienced homelessness between 6 and 12 months (11.1%).
- 16.6% of adults counted (interviewees and HH members) indicated they served in the armed forces.
- 26.16% of persons indicated they are survivors of domestic violence. Of those, 56.36% indicated that it contributed to their homelessness.
- 48.56% of persons reported that they are using health care services.
- Individuals reported multiple conditions with substance use (24.8%) and serious mental health issues (17.9%) being the most frequently reported. (Individuals were able to report multiple conditions.)
- 15.96% of individuals interviewed reported they were employed on a part-time or full- time basis.
- Economic conditions were contributing factors to individuals becoming homeless including the loss of employment and unable to pay rent or mortgage. Figure 15 illustrates conditions that individuals reported contributed to becoming homeless. (Individuals were able to report multiple conditions.)

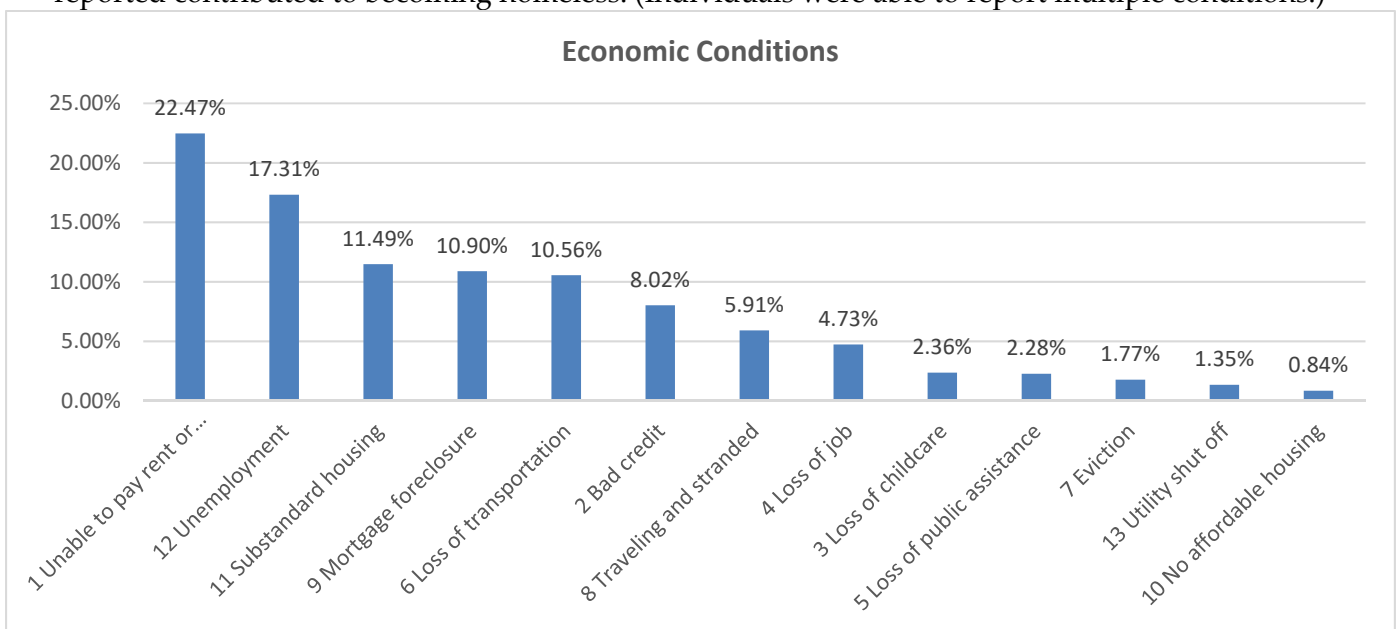

- 52.44% of individuals reported having some sort of income. Of the individuals reporting, 30.23% reported employment income, followed by Social Security (26.43%), and disability income (25.37%). In addition, 9.73% of individuals reported funds from family and friends, 4.65% reported receiving Veterans’ compensation, 2.33% reported having savings, and 1.27% indicated they receive unemployment benefits.

#### Youth/Young Adults under 25

- 63 unaccompanied young adults (18-24) were counted. There were five parenting youth (18-24) counted which included nine (9) adults and eight (8) children.
- When asked where they sleep most often, 88.5% reported outdoors and 11.5% indicated couch surfing.
- When asked about the reasons for being homeless, youth reported issues with friends or family members and unhealthy relationships (48.8%) and because of violence (24.4%) as primary reasons. In addition, some youth reported having run-away (12.5%).

## COUNTY REPORTS

Each county has its own data report that provides information specific to the community.

- The data in the report is focused on the individuals and their household members who were unsheltered on the night of January 23, 2018.
- The data reported about individuals who identified themselves as veterans includes the individuals interviewed, as well as, individuals they identified in their household that also served in the military.
- For the tables that provide data about personal conditions and statuses, the total number of conditions named may be larger than the number of individuals counted. The reason for this is that individuals were able to choose multiple applicable conditions in each category.
- Demographic data provides the total of individuals interviewed and the household members they identified.
- The final table in the report provides a summary of the number of projects, types of projects, number of persons housed and the capacity for all projects that are included in the HUD Housing Inventory Chart. Projects include those reported through HMIS and those pocket and domestic violence shelters that completed the survey distributed as a part of the point in time process.
