Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA - P.L. 113-128)

Signed into law on July 22, 2014

- Strengthen and improve the nation's workforce system
- Help individuals, including youth and those with significant barriers to employment, into high-quality jobs.
- Assist employers hire and retain skilled workers.
- Authorizes local workforce development areas administered by local workforce development boards

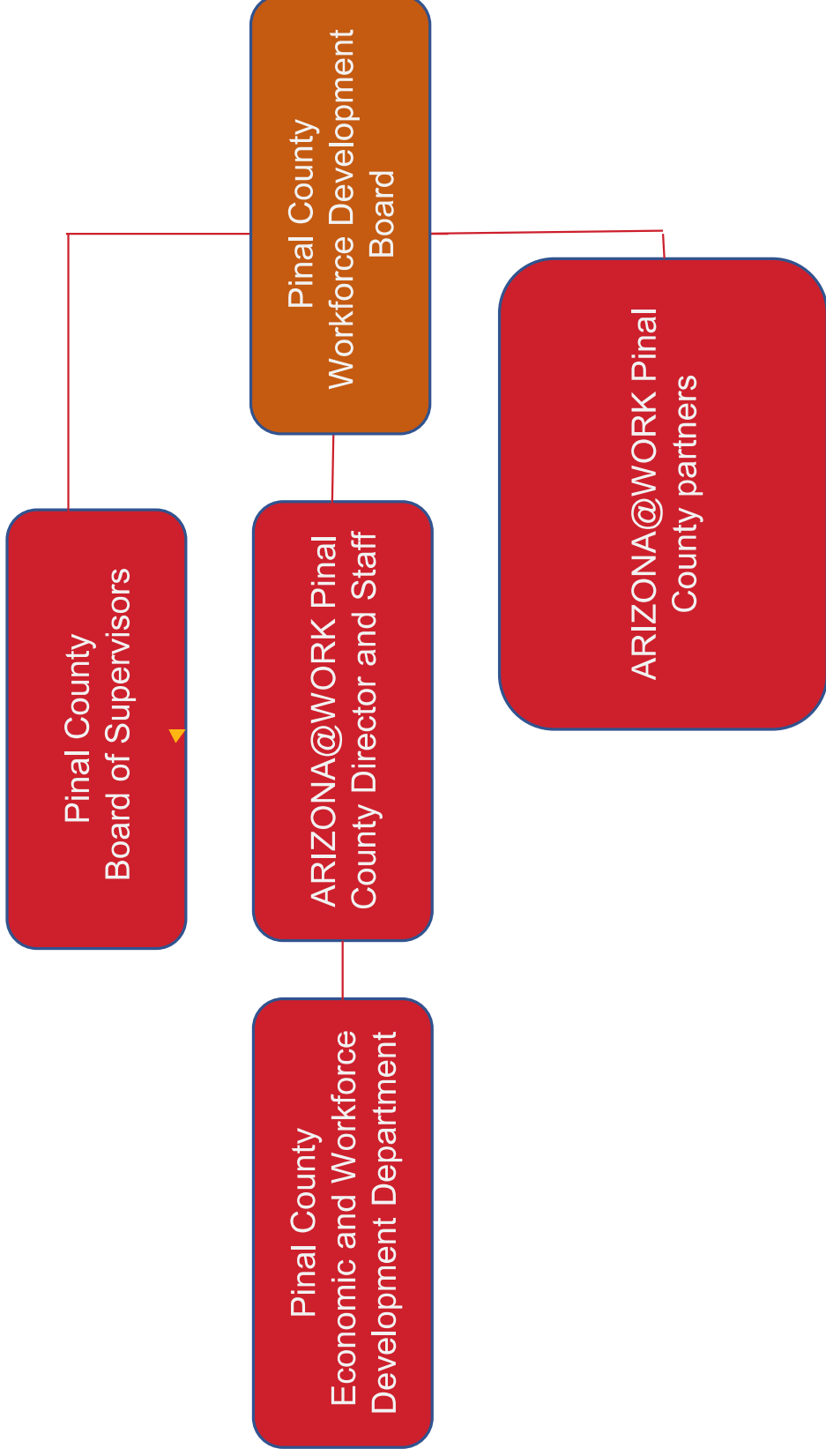

Veterans Priority of Service



Eligible veterans and their spouses have priority for services such as job search assistance, training programs, and other employment and placement services

Veterans Priority of Service apply to our program funded by the U.S. Department of Labor

This means that a veteran or an eligible spouse either receives access to a service earlier in time than a non-covered person or, if the resource is limited, the veteran or eligible spouse receives access to the service instead of or before the non-covered person.

VETERAN TOOLKIT

Transitioning into a new job can be a financial challenge. The Arizona Department of Veterans' Services has partnered with ARIZONA@WORK and the Arizona Housing Coalition to provide veterans with the Veteran Toolkit, which funds expenses associated with beginning employment.

Veterans who:

- Live in Arizona
- Served in the U.S. Military
- Enroll in an Arizona Job Connection with ARIZONA@WORK
- Identify the job they need supplies for

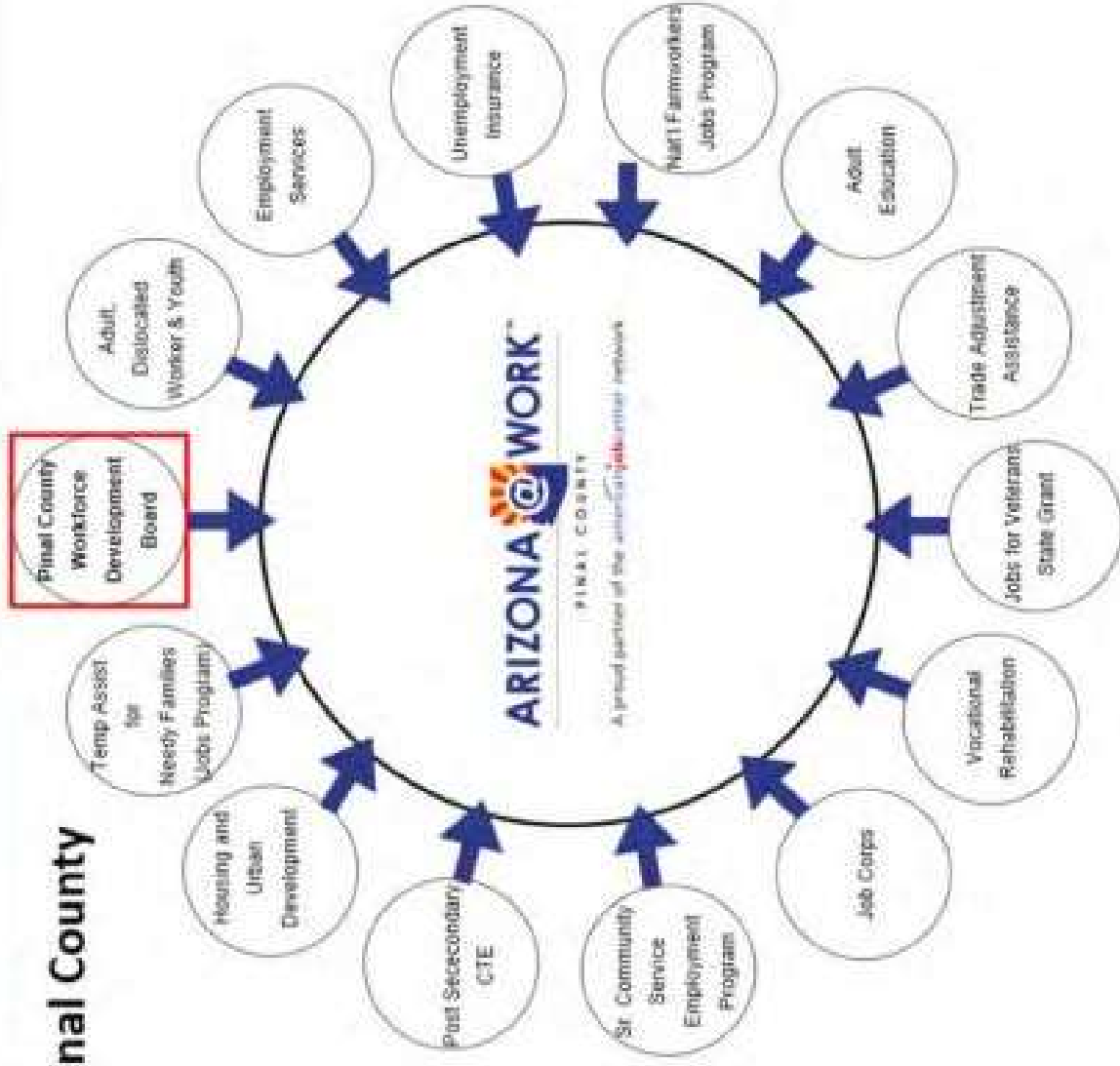
VISIT ANY ARIZONA@WORK OFFICE TO APPLY.

- Eligible items include work clothing, tools, protective equipment, transportation, and essential electronic devices. ADVS will review all other requests on a case-by-case basis.
- We will not accept applications submitted after five days of the veteran starting a job.

Supportive Services

Supportive Services are available to allow eligible participants participate in career and training activities:

- Transportation assistance
- Books and training related expenses
- Certifications test fees and other fees
- Uniforms and work wear, and work shoes
- Rental assistance and utility assistance

Supportive services availability may differ based on the partner program and the availability of funds.

Skill Development Services

- **Work Experience** - Paid Internships with employers in Pinal County
- **Occupational Skills Training** - Training that provides vocational skills to perform technical tasks required in a in-demand occupation in Pinal County. The Training program must be listed on the ETPL. Individual Training Account limit \$6,000.
- **On-the-Job Training (OJT)** - Training provided through a contract with an employer who is reimbursed a percentage of the wage rate of the participant being trained OJT.
- **Customized Training** - Training provided through a contract and designed for requirements of an employer or group of employers, which is related to new production, upgrading to new jobs that require new skills. Employer pays a percentage of the training cost.
- **Incumbent Worker Training** - Training that helps current employees gain skills to keep their jobs and avoid layoffs. It is provided through a contract between ARIZONA@WORK Pinal County and employers, who must commit to retaining trained workers after completion.
- **Registered Apprenticeships** - Employment that includes training based on an approved set of standards which includes OJT and related technical instruction in a classroom instruction setting. Registered apprenticeships are jobs from day one!

What is the H3 method?

Occupations that are **HIGH DEMAND** ① have a significant number projected job openings over the next two years in Pinal County, providing numerous opportunities for employment.

Occupations that require some level of education and on-the-job training are more likely to equip workers with skills which provide opportunities for advancement in the workforce, and are considered to be **HIGH SKILL** ①.

Occupations that provide a Living Wage are more likely to result in economic self sufficiency and are considered to be **HIGH WAGE** ①.

Each Occupation is assigned an **IN-DEMAND RATING** ①.

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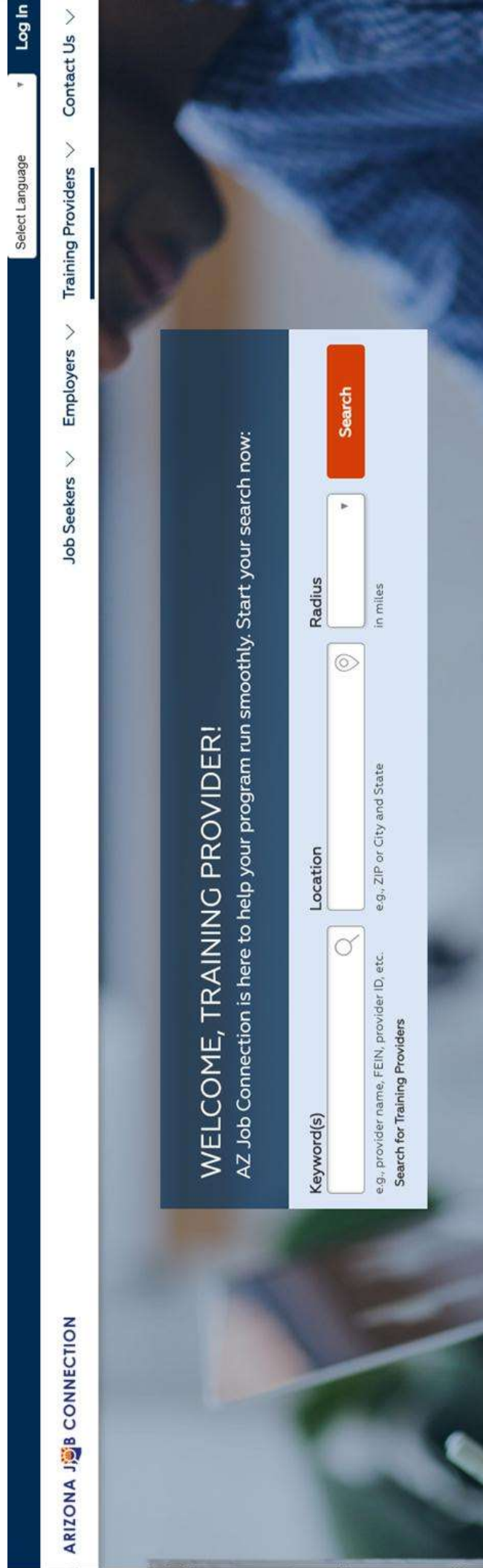
